

NOMINATING COMMITTEE PROCESS/ELECTIONS TIMELINE - 2024

Governance Board

- Governance Board members are organizations, not individuals. Individuals sitting on the board are the designated representatives of the member organization and can be replaced at will by the member organization
- Only NEUAC members in good standing are eligible for nomination to the Governance Board This means the organization's 2024 membership dues must be paid in full
- Members can self-nominate or be nominated by another member
- Members elected in 2024 will serve for three years, taking office officially immediately following the Annual Membership Meeting held at the NEUAC Annual Conference in Chicago, IL; tentatively slated for 4:30 p.m. CT on Tuesday, May 21, 2024
- The Governance Board is elected by the NEUAC membership

Board Composition

- The Governance Board should be composed of a majority of nonprofit organizations
- The Governance Board shall be comprised of **no more than 35** member organizations
- Total current Governance Board members 33
 - Board members with terms expiring in 2024 9
 - Nonprofit 6
 - Utility 3
 - Board members with terms not expiring 24
 - Nonprofit 12
 - Utility 12
 - Maximum number of 2024-2025 Governance Board Members to be elected 11
 - Maximum number of nonprofits to be elected no maximum
 - Maximum number of utilities to be elected 5
 - Expiring and cannot be nominated for another term 3
 - Nonprofit 2
 - Utility 1
 - Expiring, but eligible to be nominated for a second, three-year term 6
 - Nonprofit 4
 - Utility 2

NOTE: Must be nominated and elected to serve second term

Executive Committee

- The Executive Committee should be composed of a majority of individuals from nonprofit organizations
- The Executive Committee is elected by the **outgoing** Governance Board
- Officers must be members of the Governance Board for the service year they are elected to the Executive Committee, may serve a maximum of two years in the same position, and must be nominated and elected or re-elected annually
- Current Officers:

 - 2nd Vice President Keelie Gustin (year 1 of 2)

 - Secretary Michael Bell, Washington Gas (year 1 of 2)
 - Parliamentarian Michael Bradford, Salvation Army
 - Past President Rhonda Harper, Citizens Energy Group

Red indicates an individual with term expiring in May 2024 who <u>CANNOT</u> be re-elected to the Executive Committee

Yellow indicates an individual with term expiring in May 2024 who <u>CAN</u> be re-elected to the Executive Committee but only in a different position than the one currently held

TENTATIVE 2024 ELECTIONS TIMELINE

- **3/11/24 Call for Nominations** for election to the Governance Board sent to 2024 NEUAC members in good standing
- 3/29/24 Deadline for Governance Board nominations
 Staff verify that each organization nominated is a NEUAC member in good standing
- **4/5/24 Deadline to share official ballot for Governance Board with NEUAC membership** (*Must deliver to all eligible members no later than 45 days prior to Annual Membership Meeting*)
 - To be emailed to the primary contact for each NEUAC member organization in good standing, along with the announcement of the annual meeting slated for 5/21/24
 - Even though many organizations have more than one active individual, the organization may submit only one vote
 - Partial ballots are counted; unidentified or duplicate ballots are not

4/19/24	Credentials and Elections Committee to certify Governance Board election results
4/22/24	Call for Nominations for NEUAC Officers (Executive Committee) Sent to outgoing (current) Governance Board members in good standing
5/1/24	Deadline for Executive Committee nominations
5/6/24	Ballot for Executive Committee sent to Governance Board members
5/15/24	Deadline for completed ballots for all Executive Committee officers
5/17/24	Credentials and Elections Committee to certify officer election results
5/20/24	 Summer NEUAC Governance Board Meeting Last meeting of outgoing Governance Board Approval of officers' election results by vote Approval of incoming Advisory Board members
5/21/24	 Annual Membership Meeting Acceptance of Governance Board election results by vote The results of the election, including election of all board members regardless of type and election of officers, will be presented by the Chair of the C&E Committee at the
